How to Identify a Potential Best-Fit College(s)

- → Perspective What's the best part of college golf?
- → Take an inventory
 - Evaluate your current academic resume (GPA & SAT or ACT) and your future academic goals.
 - Evaluate your tournament results and competitive experience.
 - What is your commitment to both academics and golf?
- → Do your due diligence

It is **CRITICAL** and **ESSENTIAL** to perform in-depth research on schools/golf programs.

- Utilize on-line resources
 - o Research school's respective website (academic profile, coach's bio, roster, team stats, tournament schedule, etc.) as well as college golf websites (listed below).
 - Pay particular attention to the scoring averages of the top **4-5 players**.
- Visit campuses
- Attend a college golf tournament –
- Know the NCAA rules
 - Visit <u>www.eligibilitycenter.org</u> to familiarize yourself with the NCAA recruiting rules and eligibility requirements. *Guide for the College Bound Student-Athlete* is a <u>must resource</u>.
- → Determine Criteria
- → Understand all your options
 - DI, DII, DIII, NAIA, junior college & NCCGA
 - o It's about what fits YOU
 - o It is essential to be happy with the school without golf
- → Be Proactive
- YOU must take ownership of this process
- Develop a preliminary list of schools based on your research and initial college criteria.
- Send coach an introductory letter, golf & academic resume, swing video and upcoming tournament schedule.
 - o Include a few "reach" schools and a few "safety" schools to compliment your list of potential "best-fit" schools.
- Follow up emails (personalize communication), calls, and visits, and continue to COMPETE.
- List of schools is fluid & process is ever changing.
- **→** Summary

It is essential to be positive, remain open to all possibilities and be **<u>proactive</u>** throughout the recruiting process. Remember, there is a place for everybody to play college golf.
